**Job Summary** 

PEACE:

Service Responsibilities:

- 1. Interviews children, prepares case histories, and outlines services provided by the agency.
- 2. Assesses the impact of witnessing abuse on the child and prepares a counseling plan in conjunction with the parents/caregivers.
- 3. Assesses group readiness of children and provides individual counseling for those not ready for group or when developmental age group is not available.
- 4. Conducts individual counseling with the child and/or individual members of his/her family in such a manner that promotes the process of healing and that teaches the child non-violent ways of resolving conflict, may use art therapy and play therapy and other methods based on need.
- 5. Develops and conducts psycho-educational support groups for children; conduct post-group interviews with children and/or their families; recommends follow-up services where necessary.
- 6. Provides information, emotional support, and advocacy to the child and/or individual members of child's family and makes referrals to other community service providers, resources, and professionals as required.
- 7. Participates in or initiates case conferences with other professionals as required.
- 8. Maintains related records and statistics as per Ministry contract and produces reports as required.
- 9. Maintains current knowledge of issues and resources related to abuse and violence; conducts presentations and public awareness activities aimed at stopping intergenerational cycle of abuse; participates in relevant community/regional committees to ensure client-centered, coordinated services.
- 10. Preforms other related duties as required.
- (ii) Skilled in group process and facilitation techniques; skilled in teaching safety techniques and in providing advocacy services.
- (iii) Ability to work effectively with other agency staff, agency teams, and with community.
- (iv) Good organizational, case management, time and stress management skills.

## Qualifications:

Education & Experience:

- ➤ Bachelor's Degree in a related human/social services field
- Requires 2 years related Experience.

Additional specialized course content related to child abuse, assessment, and treatment are beneficial.

Job Skills and Abilities:
